Hon. Lenora Qerequetabua to ask the Minister for Lands and Mineral Resources – Can the Minister inform Parliament on the following –

a) total number of applications received in the period from 1 January 2023 to 31 July 2024 for license to extract low value minerals by division –

A total of **81 applications** was received from 1 January 2023 to 31 July 2024 for license to extract low value minerals (Tabulated below is the breakdown by Divisions).

b) total number of licenses issued in the period from 1 January 2023 to
31 July 2024 to extract low value minerals by division –

A total of **65 licenses** was issued from 1 January 2023 to 31 July 2024 for license to extract low value minerals (Tabulated below is the breakdown by Divisions).

c) total number of applications rejected or shelved in the period from 1 January 2023 to 31 July 2024 for license to extract low value minerals by division –

Applications rejected/shelved from 1 January 2023 to 31 July 2024:

- ✓ North 12
- √ West 2
- ✓ Central Eastern 0

Low value mineral refers to aggregates such as river gravel and sand which is administered by the Director of Lands who grants licenses that are issued for extraction.
