 - (iv) That the Bill must be debated and voted upon by Parliament on Thursday, 13 March 2025, but that 1 hour be given to debate the Bill, with the right of reply given to him as the Member moving the motion.

- (b) The Attorney-General the Hon. Graham Leung moved a motion pursuant to Standing Order 51
 - (i) That the **Cinematographic Films (Amendment) Bill 2025** be considered by Parliament without delay;
 - (ii) That the Bill must pass through one stage at a single sitting of Parliament;
 - (iii) That the Bill must not be referred to a standing committee or other committee of Parliament; and
 - (iv) That the Bill must be debated and voted upon by Parliament on Thursday, 13 March 2025, but that 1.5 hours be given to debate the Bill, with the right of reply given to him as the Member moving the motion.
