Inosi Kuridrani to ask the Hon Prime Minister, and Minister for Civil Service and Strategic Planning, National Development and Statistics – Can the Prime Minister update Parliament on the formulation of Fiji’s third Voluntary National Review Report on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- 3/2026 Hon. Premila Kumar to ask the Minister for Finance, Commerce and Business Development – In light of rising global fuel prices driven by ongoing tensions in the Middle East, will the Government consider reducing the fuel tax levy.
- 4/2026 Hon. Sakiusa Tubuna to ask the Minister for Agriculture, Waterways, and Sugar Industry – Can the Minister update Parliament on the Grant Agreement between the Government of Fiji and the Asian Development Bank on enhancing climate resilience of coastal communities project.
