Oral Questions

- 15/2026 Hon. Inosi Kuridrani to ask the Minister for Foreign Affairs and External Trade – Can the Minister update Parliament on the Memorandum of Understanding between the State of Israel and the Republic of Fiji on Co-operation in Diplomatic Training.

Joseph Nand to ask the Minister for Employment, Productivity and Workplace Relations – Can the Minister update Parliament on the Ministry’s enforcement and compliance efforts to ensure all sectors, including the 10 sectoral industries, are adhering to increase in the National Minimum Wage.
